FBI surveillance proposal sets up facebook clash --- agency's new push on social media appears to violate company policy, its settlement with U.S. Wall Street Journal. Also have students read <u>Twitter policies</u> regarding law enforcement use so they understand what warrants are required to access social data
- <u>Facebook has been charged with housing discrimination by the US government</u>. There
 are several other articles that could be sourced for this or additional fines in the EU. Set
 up the topic of questionable practices that can be used by advertisers in targeting ads
 that creates discrimination on the social network.
